


Welcome to New Members!

A NEW FINGERPRINT PROCESSING TECHNIQUE

In 2008, Dr. John Bond a researcher from England has developed a technique for processing metal surfaces to locate latent fingerprints. He has determined how to develop a fingerprint on a brass shell casing even if the surface has been wiped clean after being touched. During his research, he learned that human fingers cause salt to be deposited on surfaces when they make contact



with them. This often happens when a person sweats and they touch an object. Dr. Bond concluded even after a weapon has fired the bullet in question, the shell casing will continue to exhibit the print as it is "etched" into the surface by the chemical process. Since the fingerprint is still "hidden" from view, his process will assist in revealing the underlying print.

The process can be completed as follows: A shell casing is placed against an electrical terminal and charged. Then electrically charged ceramic beads are coated with very fine black colored powder which is then poured on the corroded portion of the shell casing. The fingerprint pattern is then revealed and the questioned sample is then photographed and ready for a standard comparison.

In the articles I have reviewed, Dr. Bond continues to experiment with the technique and it appears to be gaining an interest in this country as well. In fact, Detective Lisa Maxwell, Thomasville Police Department, Thomasville, GA indicated a few months ago her intension to request Dr. Bond's assistance in processing evidence in one of her cases.
